What Defines Us:

Housing co-operatives are autonomous, non-profit entities, and count on members to participate in the day to day operation of the co-operative. In this way, costs are kept to a minimum resulting in affordable housing for the membership. Bylaws, policies and procedures are established in compliance with The Co-operatives Act 1996, and The Co-operatives Regulations 1998, and as such are binding. Amendments are voted on by the membership. Co-operatives are based on the principles of self-help, self-responsibility, democracy, equality, equity and solidarity. Their foundation was birthed on the ethical values of honesty, openness, and social responsibility.

Benefits and Responsibilities:
